World Prison Population List (fifth edition)

Roy Walmsley

The World Prison Population List gives details of the number of prisoners held in 205 independent countries and dependent territories. It shows the differences in the level of imprisonment across the world and makes possible an estimate of the world prison population total.

Key points

- Over 9 million people are held in penal institutions throughout the world, mostly as pre-trial detainees (remand prisoners) or having been convicted and sentenced. About half of these are in the United States (2.03m), Russia (0.86m) or China (1.51m plus pre-trial detainees and prisoners in 'administrative detention').
- The United States has the highest prison population rate in the world, some 701 per 100,000 of the national population, followed by Russia (606), Belarus (554), Kazakhstan and the U.S. Virgin Islands (both 522), the Cayman Islands (501), Turkmenistan (489), Belize (459), Bermuda (447), Suriname (437), Dominica (420) and Ukraine (415).
- However, more than three fifths of countries (60.5%) have rates below 150 per 100,000. (The
 United Kingdom's rate of 141 per 100,000 of the national population places it above the midpoint in the World List; it is the highest among countries of the European Union.)
- Prison population rates vary considerably between different regions of the world, and between different parts of the same continent. For example:
 - □ in Africa the median rate for western and central African countries is 48 whereas for southern African countries it is 327:
 - in the Americas the median rate for south American countries is 126 whereas for Caribbean countries it is 297;
 - □ in Asia the median rate for south central Asian countries (mainly the Indian sub-continent) is 59 whereas for (ex-Soviet) central Asian countries it is 390;
 - in Europe the median rate for southern European countries is 76.5 whereas for central and eastern European countries it is 200;
 - in Oceania (including Australia and New Zealand) the median rate is 111.5.
- Prison populations are growing in many parts of the world. Updated information on countries included in previous editions of the World Prison Population List shows that prison populations have risen in 71% of these countries (in 61% of countries in Africa, 71% in the Americas, 90% in Asia, 66% in Europe and 69% in Oceania).

This fifth edition of the World Prison Population List has been compiled, like previous editions, from a variety of sources. In almost all cases the original source is the national prison administration of the country concerned, or else the Ministry responsible for the prison administration. Most figures relate to dates between late 1999 and November 2003. Since prison population rates (per 100,000 of the national population) are based on estimates of the

national population they should not be regarded as precise. In order to compare prison population rates in different regions of the world, and to estimate the number of persons held in prison in the countries for which information is not available, median rates have been used because they minimise the effect of countries with rates that are untypically high or low.

The List has a number of weaknesses. It lacks information on 17 independent countries and figures do not relate to the same date. Comparability is further compromised by different practice in different countries, for example with regard to whether all pre-trial detainees and juveniles are held under the authority of the prison administration, and also whether the prison administration is responsible for psychiatrically ill offenders and offenders being detained for treatment for alcoholism. People held in custody are usually omitted from national totals if they are not under the authority of the prison administration.

Despite its limitations it is hoped that the World Prison Population List will be found useful by academic criminologists who are studying the use of imprisonment world-wide and by non-governmental organisations who are interested in variations in criminal justice practice. The data – for all its imperfections – may prompt fresh thought among policy makers and other criminal justice experts about the size of the prison population in their country, given the huge costs and disputed efficacy of imprisonment.
